Notes from the Cantor

Between Pesach and Shavuot, our thoughts turn to the land of Israel, with three special holidays added to the calendar in modern times:

- Yom HaZikaron (May 1) –Israeli Memorial Day
- Yom HaAtzmaut (May 2) – Israeli Independence Day
- Yom Yerushalayim (May 24) Jerusalem Day, commemorating the reunification of Jerusalem following the Six Day war in 1967.

At PTBAS, we will celebrate Yom HaAtzmaut on May 6 with an Israeli-style luncheon and dancing in the PTBAS social hall following Shabbat morning services. On May 19, the ARZA committee will lead Friday evening services on the Shabbat before Yom Yerushalayim.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the reunification of Jerusalem. Fifty years is a time period of great significance in the Torah: “Yovel” – the Jubilee Year. Through happy coincidence, or perhaps something more divinely managed, the Torah portion which is read on the Shabbat before Yom Yerushalayim, concerns the Jubilee year:

“You shall hallow the fiftieth year. You shall proclaim release throughout the land for all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you...” (Leviticus 25:10)

That is the Plaut translation, but you may be more familiar with the way this verse is inscribed on the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia: *“Proclaim LIBERTY Throughout all the Land unto all the Inhabitants Thereof.”* In the jubilee year, according to Torah, all indentured servants must be released and all land must be returned to the original holdings. The people of biblical times certainly bought and sold land (as well as people) but were instructed by Torah that *“the land must not be sold beyond reclaim, for the land is Mine; you are but strangers resident with Me.” (Leviticus 25:23)*

Now, I’m guessing that when you hear the phrase “the land is Mine,” you may burst out singing, “God gave this land to me!” The Hebrew language has no capital letters, but even so the Torah text, unlike the song from the movie “Exodus,” makes it clear that the land belongs to God, not us. For this special year, the fiftieth anniversary of the Six Day War and the reunification of Jerusalem, the rabbis at T’ruah, the rabbinic call for human rights, have prepared a study curriculum using the concept of Yovel and commentary from across the centuries to frame our conversation about the land of Israel. “Yovel – A Sourcebook for Fifty Years” asks how understanding the land as belonging to God might shape how we think about Israeli and Palestinian aspirations. T’ruah has asked me to facilitate a study session about Yovel at the community-wide Tikun L’eil Shavuot (Shavuot evening study) at Congregation Beth Elohim on May 30. Actually, it will be May 31 because I will be teaching in the midnight to 1:00 AM slot! While I would dearly love to see friendly faces from our congregation at CBE, I am actually going to use the same curriculum at our own Shavuot study session in our social hall from 7:30 to 9:00 PM (on May 30) so you will have a chance to discuss the insights of the Torah’s jubilee year at a more reasonable hour, and also you will help me feel more confident going to CBE later that night. Thank you! Our study will be preceded by a festive Shavuot dinner at which we will welcome and honor this year’s new members: Elaine Moss, Sylvia Kaplan and Sally Brown. We will be celebrating Shavuot, our new members, and the Jubilee year, all in one evening. That’s a lot of joy! Reservations are required for the dinner, but not for the study session.

As we count the days to Shavuot, the day on which we celebrate the receiving of Torah, I wish you in advance, CHAG SAMEACH!

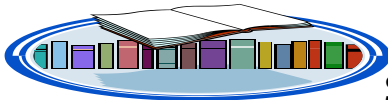

LIKE DREAMERS by Yossi Klein Halevi
